# Off the Top of My Head



Several of the sessions offered solutions to the many challenges faced by today's churches. ### **Capital Campaign Clarification**

In the June issue of the Columns, we discussed the Board of Trustees plans for the capital campaign to raise funds for a new elevator. An anonymous donor has offered to match every contribution of \$10,000 with another \$1,000. In the following example, the 13 top, qualifying donations could net an additional \$19,000:

- One \$25,000 donation receives an additional \$2,000
- Five \$20,000 donations (\$100,000 total) generate an additional \$10,000
- Seven \$10,000 donations (\$70,000) result in an additional \$7,000

A total of \$195,000 in donations generates \$19,000 from the anonymous donor for a total of \$214,000 or 50.6% of our campaign goal! It adds up!

## Children, Youth & Education Sunday on June 2nd






The 3,4, and 5-year-olds and 1st and 2nd grade Sunday School classes entertained the congregation. (left)


