# Off the Top of My Head

In his book, *The Yoke of Christ*, Elton Trueblood quotes a letter from a schoolgirl who probes the depth of her soul. She writes:

I've been thinking much this year about the importance of caring, of the passion of life. I've often realized that it takes courage to care. Caring is dangerous. It leaves you open to hurt and to looking like a fool. And perhaps it's because they have been hurt so often that people are afraid to care. You can't die if you're not alive. And then who would rather be a stone? I have found many places in my own life where I keep a secret store of indifference as a sort of self-protection.

That's a penetrating insight -- a secret store of indifference. We are to care, because Christ cared -- even though it means a cross.

It doesn't take long to realize how blessed we are. We have comfortable, safe homes. We sit down to eat



meals with plenty of leftovers. We sleep in warm soft beds. Then I realize there are many in our own community who don't have such blessings. This realization struck me hard as I watched the increased demand on our local food supplies. I realized I do care about these people I have never met. I realized I can do something to help provide for the most basic necessities of life. You can too.

While shopping right now can be a challenge, we still can reach out and support the Tosa Food Bank through our Easter Special Offering. We all hear calls for caring for one another in this difficult time.

We need to battle the store of indifference. We need to risk the hurt of caring. Christ cared – we must too.

#### **Covenant Class**


Until FCC reopens, Rev. Trump and Tonia Wallner will be contacting members of the class with instructions.

### A Note From Pastor Barry

According to C. S. Lewis, it is interesting that "It is only for our bad behavior that we find . . . explanations. It is only our bad temper that we put down to being tired or worried or hungry. We put our good temper down to ourselves." He points out that we make all sorts of excuses. We were unfair to our children because we were very tired. We did some

shady business because we were very hard up. We didn't help (fill in a name – or someone's description here) because we were frightfully busy. And, as to our wife, husband, sister, brother, we didn't (fill in the blank here) because we were too (fill in the blank here). But C. S. Lewis makes yet another vital point, which is that if we don't believe in decent behavior, why are we so anxious to make excuses for not having behaved decently?

What Lewis seeks for us to admit to ourselves is that, in order to live a genuine, truthful, and honest life, we must think clearly about ourselves. In plain language, not to steam up a mirror so that we can't see ourselves. Isn't that the central problem we all have? Each of us desires to see ourselves in the best

light possible. I recently, and for the first time, had a body check for skin cancer [all is well and next exam is a year from now], but for my dermatologist's physician's assistant to inspect my skin under a magnifying glass was terrifying to me (and I think likewise to the PA).

Did you ever look at your intentions under

magnification? Or your soul? Our ethereal souls may be interesting for us to examine, but perhaps when we begin to carefully scrutinize each of our intentions we may not want to continue to look. We may not want to continue to analyze why we do what we do - and have done. However, we have a divine professional to heal our souls – and to help heal us. Prayerfully invite Jesus into our lives. Live with humility. Practice with persistence. When we are able to recognize our human need for God, His loving grace will be there, for Jesus

promised us that if we abide in Him, He will abide in us. (John 15.)
