# **2021 Special Easter Offering**

The money collected from the Special Easter Offering will benefit two, important missions: Tosa Community Food Pantry and Asociacion Civil Cristiana Congregational in Argentina.

Tosa Community Food Pantry is well-known to First Church. Housed at St. Bernard's Church on Harwood Avenue, the food pantry collects and distributes food to people in need in and around Wauwatosa. The demand has grown exponentially because of COVID-19. Your generosity during the pandemic has allowed First Church to provide the pantry with extra support during this challenging time. We will continue that support with a gift from the Special Easter Offering.

For several years we have designated a portion of the Special Easter Offering for the Congregational Church of Myanmar. Sadly, unrest and violence have continued since the democratically elected government was overthrown by the military this past February. As a result, the NACCC has had difficulty getting donations to the Reverend Elvis Sa Do. Both the NACCC and First Church are in communication with Rev. Sa Do, and we pray that a workable solution will be found in the near future.

The Board of Stewardship & Benevolence has decided to postpone sending a donation to the Congregational Church of Myanmar pending a secure way to transfer funds. Instead, we will direct a portion of the Easter Special Offering to Asociacion Civil Cristiana Congregational. The mission, headed by the Reverend Dr. Harding Stricker, brings the gospel and assistance to Spanish descendants living in poverty on the outskirts of Misiones, Argentina. Services include Christian education, Children Sponsorship, health care, community gardening, and a kitchen and dining room service. This past winter, Rev. Stricker and assistants prepared and distributed 30 school bags, and, more recently, bags of food.

The Special Offering envelope has been mailed to all church members. We encourage you to return your offering by mail or drop it off at the church.
