# **Drivers Needed for St. Vincent's Meal Program**

For over 30 years, a dedicated group of women and men has prepared a meal for St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) on the first Friday of each month. The individuals and families who eat at St. Vincent's love the dinner, which includes potato crusted fish, mac and cheese, a green salad,

Jello, and cookies. For many years, Don Schaeffer picked up the meal containers and drove them to St. Paul's at 931 West Madison Street. Don is no longer able to deliver the meal, and the future of this mission depends on our ability to find volunteer drivers.



## Requirements

First, an SUV or station wagon is required to haul the food containers due to their size. Second, lifting the containers into the car requires a lot of muscle.

On the first Friday of the month, the volunteer driver picks up the meal at the church at about 3:15 pm. (There's often someone here to help load the SUV). The meal is driven to St. Vincent's southside location, 931 W. Madison, where SVDP staff unload the SUV and take the meal inside. There's a little wait while staff transfer all food to their own serving pans and return the empty containers to the SUV. The driver then brings the empty containers back to the church. The entire process typically takes about 2 hours.

### Many Hands Make Light Work

The goal is to have a few volunteers who can share the responsibility. That way, no one is responsible for driving every single month.

First Church's mission to SVDP for one meal a month.
