Guest facilitators from the Pilgrim Center for Reconciliation in Minneapolis will lead the group through a retreat on the "Rhythm of Ministry," followed by a workshop on growing common bonds amid conflict and cultural polarization. The center was founded by the late Reverend Dr. Arthur Rouner and his wife, Molly. Dr. Rouner was Senior Pastor of the Colonial Church of Edina in Minnesota for 32 years, a prolific author and well-known Congregationalist . The Pilgrim Center for Reconciliation has worked with churches, organizations, veterans, students, women leaders, seniors, Native-Americans, refugees, and many others in several different states to bring healing to people and organizations in conflict. The center has also established country-wide movements in Rwanda and Uganda and supports the work of reconciliation in several other Eastern African countries including Burundi, Congo, Kenya, and South Sudan.

Special Easter Offering

Easter is a time to think of those who do God's work in the world. The money collected from the Special Easter Offering will benefit two important missions: Tosa Community Food Pantry and Asociacion Civil Cristiana Congregational in Argentina.

Tosa Community Food Pantry is well known to First Church. Housed at St. Bernard's Church on Harwood Avenue, the food pantry collects and distributes food to people in need in and around Wauwatosa. The demand grew exponentially during the height of COVID-19 and continues. Our support with a gift from the Special Easter Offering will help the Pantry fulfill its mission.

Last year, Stewardship chose to dedicate part of the Easter Offering to Asociacion Civil Cristiana Congregational in Argentina because the war in Myanmar was making it impossible to get money to the Congregational Church of Myanmar and Rev. Elvis Sa Do. That situation continues, so we will again provide part of the offering to the mission in Argentina.

Headed by the Reverend Dr. Harding Stricker, Asociacion Civil Cristiana Congregational brings the gospel and material assistance to Spanish descendants living in poverty on the outskirts of Misiones, Argentina. Services include Christian education, Children Sponsorship, health care, community gardening, and a kitchen and dining room service. The mission currently provides around 250 children a hot meal every Saturday and regularly gives bags of food to 40 families. Inflation in Argentina is at 52%, which makes it more difficult to serve local needs.

The Special Offering envelope is mailed to all church members and is available in the pew pockets. We encourage you to return your offering by mail, drop it off at the church, or put it in the collection plate if you're here Sunday morning.
