A Time to Serve

Oh, my goodness! September has been a whirlwind of reconnections, trying some new ideas, and experiencing the joys, griefs, times of struggle, as well as inspiration. I am so grateful to live all of these with you. As we step into October, I pray we continue to grow together in the knowledge AND expression of our faith.



Some of our hopes and intentions for October reverberate with a couple of "new ideas" we have begun implementing. — our Covenant sessions with our youth and expanding our time together. The team of Tonia, Chip, and I are supported in the facilitating of theses ideas by the deeper relationship with, and support of, those who agreed to be mentors. There is also is a youth Bible study on the third Sunday morning of each month that began because the youth requested it. New classrooms, teacher teams, and the growing response from those of you drawn to be part of that is, again, so encouraging. These are just the youth-related things. You will see other articles and opportunities related to adult formation.

I would also like to make you aware of the Agape Tables that we offer near the Milwaukee and Madison college campuses. Rob Fredrickson (From Ozaukee Congregational) and I meet with college students and young adults in the area for dinner and conversation. Our upcoming dates are October 15 on the Madison campus, and October 29 near the Milwaukee campus. While we do have contact information for some of the students from our churches, please let me know if you are aware of a student or young adult that we might also invite.

One of the "newish" and growing opportunities we have is our morning Saturday Serve on October 18. It offers a variety of ways to reach out with compassion.

On site at church: Make bag lunches for St. Vincent or make Plarn (plastic yarn made from recycled grocery bags) which will be knit into waterproof sleeping mats for unhoused or currently homeless people. Enjoy yard work? Help prepare some of the church grounds for winter.

Offsite: Go to Milwaukee Rescue Mission to serve lunch or spend the morning at the Congregational Home serving breakfast, chat with residents, help transport residents to Chapel for exercise, followed by another program. Or could go to one of the Bridge to Brighter apartments to work on cleaning and painting. The apartments are for youth who aged out of Foster Care.

These opportunities are for all ages. Find more details about particulars on the signup sheet on the Gathering Table in the Atrium.

We look forward to holding another fall session that will bring visitors and church members together to learn about Congregationalism and First Church. If you're interested, please put your name on the sign-up sheet on the Gathering Table as soon as possible.

Finally, in addition to reading the number of articles others write, I am grateful for the work our moderator JC Moore is doing to keep you updated on some of the behind the scenes work and meetings. If you have thoughts or questions, please do speak up and let us know.


Stewardship and Benevolence



Following a moment of prayer, we'll disperse to our chosen projects. Most of us will be done by 11:00 am.

In case you're not familiar with it, "plarn" is plastic yarn created from plastic bags. The plarn will be given to an organization that creates weather-resistant sleeping mats for the homeless.
