Spiritual Enrichment Continues This Summer

Great is the LORD and most worthy of praise... One generation commends your works to another, they tell of your mighty acts. (Psalm 145:3-4)

As you read this, Confirmation Sunday and our special Celebration Sunday, with some incredible music from Chancel Choir and Jubilation Ringers, have happened. If you feel as I do, then your heart is full! You will see later in the Columns the information parents and mentors wrote about the seven young people we journeyed with this year. If you were unable to be here that day, I recommend you listen to the livestream of the May 17 Worship Service as the “sermon” was a compilation of things they wrote in their faith statements. To hear them, is to affirm HOPE.

Now, we look ahead to Children and Youth Sunday on June 7 at 10:00 am. Each year the Sunday School classes each prepare something special to present. Our youth will offer up some of their music; scholarships will be awarded; and we will recognize our graduating seniors – again a morning you won’t want to miss. (And, of course, we celebrate them with ice cream on Ridge Court following the Worship Service.)

Our summer schedule begins on June 14, with one service at 10:00 am. We will hear from Luke’s gospel about Jesus sending out his disciples, and we will commission our Mission Team to go “out” on June 15 to paint, clean, and clear trails at our church camp in Mt. Morris before its season begins. (Church camp in July is where many of our youth have what they call “the best week of the year.”) I am especially excited about the All Boards Lunch and Meeting after worship on June 14. Each board will review, reflect, look forward, and have intentional conversations about where or what God is sending us into for the upcoming year.

Our summer months bring us a wonderful variety of guest vocalist/musicians, while the Chancel Choir takes a pause. A one-room Sunday School for children is planned, and worship bags with activities are on hand for little ones who remain in worship.

June also kicks off the first of our Wednesday “Midday Music and Lunch” series (see dates and details), with Early Morning Rain vocal trio. It is an hour to enjoy a variety of music and meet old and new friends while lunching.

Later in June, delegate Hank Collis and I will attend our National Association of Congregational Christian Churches Annual Meeting and Conference in Massachusetts – bringing with us hand-knitted hats and scarves and self care items donated by the Board of Benevolence to the NACCC’s Intergenerational Mission project for Seafarers Friends. You will be hearing from us about what we learn during meetings and from speakers. Which reminds me: Ann Harris, Tonia Wallner, and I, along with several other First Church members, attended our Wisconsin Congregational Association meeting in May. We heard from a number of presentations on church technology and safety. Helpful and inspiring. By the way, as Hank Collis completes the second of a three-year Lay Ministry Training program, he has been licensed by our Deacons as a Lay Minister. One of his first acts was to offer The Lord’s Supper to those at Communion and Chat at Harwood Place in May. Thank you, Hank.

Looking forward to July: there will be a hymn sing on July 5, two more Midday Music opportunities on July 8 and 29, and our youth head to church camp July 12-17. Consider writing a letter and/or sending a card to them.

And, if you know anything about us, you know that additional opportunities seem to keep bubbling up to engage with groups such as Women’s Ministry (Tuesdays) and Men’s Ministry (Wednesdays). Do you have an interest you would like to share with others, favorite summer books to read, topical conversations... Let’s talk about it.

Meet up with friends for a labyrinth walk at Hartung Park on Thursday, July 9 and 30, at 6:30 pm. It is a time to “walk out” your thoughts and prayers, and experience a calming centering. Also, “Good Vibes” continues each Tuesday at 5:30 pm in the upstairs Parlor: time for quiet meditation, sharing inspirations, and praying for concerns entered in the prayer book outside the Chapel. Come, invite a friend to join you. It is good.

These books use the New Language Translation (NLT) of the Bible and read more like a story than a traditional Bible.
